Beyond the city of St Albans there is plenty to explore. There are many pretty towns and villages such as Harpenden, Redbourn and Wheathampstead to the north and London Colney and Bricket Wood to the south. They all have fascinating histories and stories to tell.

There are many footpaths, bridleways, byways and quiet country lanes providing lots of opportunities to get active outdoors, and at Heartwood Forest, near Sandridge, the creation of England's largest new native forest is well underway.

Hidden among these villages are gems such as the working watermill and bakery at Redbournbury, and a family day out at Willows Activity Farm.

Redbourn Village Museum tells the story of the village and its links with the Cathedral, and the de Havilland Aircraft Museum features displays from modern military jets to the last surviving WW2 prototype.
